

ASSESSMENT CRITERIA:

In line with Council's resolution, applications are assessed on their capacity to deliver economic and / or social benefit to the community and their alignment with Council's strategic plan. Organisations were required to address these issues in their application process.

Given the purpose of community organisations, and that grant applications are generally for up to \$5000 only, the capacity of any project to deliver economic benefit is considered to be limited. For this reason economic weighting is given less than social weighting.

<p>The project can demonstrate an alignment to the intent of the Shire of Collie Strategic Plan 2013-2022</p> <p>Strategic Alignment Weighting 50%</p>	<p>Score 0 – 10 contingent upon alignment with the Strategic Plan.</p> <p>0 = No alignment</p> <p>2 = Minimal contribution - contributes to the achievement of a goal that underpins one Key Objective</p> <p>4 = Minor contribution - contributes to the achievement of more than one goal of one or more Key Objectives</p> <p>6 = Intermediate contribution - contributes to the achievement of an initiative that supports a Key Objective</p> <p>8 = Significant contribution - contributes to the achievement of more than one initiative</p> <p>10 = Major contribution - contributes directly to the achievement of goals and initiatives that underpin more than one Key Objective</p>	<p>Assesses the project's strategic alignment, that is, whether it meets the strategic intent of one or more of the Key Objectives</p> <p>To obtain weighting, multiply score by 5.</p>
