Registration is valid until the expiry date unless cancelled pursuant to Section 16 of the Dog Act and the Shire of Collie Local Laws.

Shire of Collie requires all dogs aged three months and over must be registered at all times. Dog owners are required to inform Council immediately of any change in ownership, the death of a dog or change in address. Failure to register a dog by the due date may result in a penalty up to \$2000 under the Dog Act.

In addition to the dog registration number tag, each dog must also have a tag on which is inscribed the owner's name and address.

The maximum number of dogs to be kept on any premises is two (2) over the age of three (3) months. Applications to keep more than the prescribed number of dogs on a property are available at the Shire Office and require strict conditions being adhered to.

To license a dog under sterilised concessional rates and owner or agent should either have a veterinarian's certificate or be prepared to sign a statutory declaration to that effect. Pro rata refunds can be made where a licensed dog becomes sterilised.
