I am / the owner is not under the age of 18 years and the details in this application are true and accurate to the best of my knowledge and belief.

The cat described in this application is ordinarily kept at the address on the application.

Registration is valid until the expiry date unless cancelled pursuant to Western Australian Cat Act 2011 and the Shire of Collie Local Laws.

Shire of Collie requires all cats aged six months and over must be sterilised, microchipped and registered at all times. Cat owners are required to inform Council immediately of any change in ownership, the death of a cat or change in address. Failure to register a cat by the due date may result in a penalty up to \$5000 under the Cat Act.

In addition to the cat registration number tag, each cat must also have a tag on which is inscribed the owner's name and address.

The maximum number of cats to be kept on any premises is three (3) over the age of six (6) months. Applications to keep more than the prescribed number of cats on a property are available at the Shire Office and require strict conditions being adhered to.

Proof of microchip and sterilisation of the cat to be registered is required, this should be a veterinarian's certificate or the owner or agent be prepared to sign a statutory declaration to that effect.

I have had no convictions for offences against this Western Australian Cat Act 2011 or Animal Welfare Act 2002 in the past three (3) years.
